We would like to suggest that you bring the following items with you:

Boxes or footlockers marked plainly with the name of the student may be sent in advance. It is requested that each student add only a minimum of extra furnishings to her room.

Rooms are approximately 12’ X 12’ and windows are approximately 46” wide and 67” tall inside the window casing. A tension curtain rod or shower stall rod that expands from 40” to 48” works well in these windows.



OTHER INFORMATION:

- **CLOTHING:** You may want to mark all articles of clothing with a laundry marker or other nametag so that they may be easily identified. This is strongly recommended if you plan to utilize the laundry service.
- **LAUNDRY:** Coin-operated washing machines and dryers are available for student use. Cost is .75 to wash and .75 to dry each load.
- **LAUNDRY SERVICE:** Optional laundry pick-up and delivery wash, dry and fold service is available by depositing money into a debit account. Soiled laundry pick-up is on Tuesdays with return delivery on Thursdays. You will receive a form to set this service up with a later mailing.

- **VALUABLES:** The school cannot be responsible for valuable jewelry or other valuable possessions, and it is strongly urged that students not bring such belongings to school.

- **ALLOWANCE:** Parents are encouraged to send spending money directly to the Dean of Students so that it may be deposited in the school bank. The school encourages the girls to spend money wisely and asks that the parents and guardians help in this matter. The Dean of Students suggests an allowance between \$15-\$25 per week to cover incidental expenses and activities. Student may opt to open a personal account at a local bank if desired.
- **HEALTH:** The Bahnon Infirmery is well equipped, and the services of a registered nurse are available. A doctor is also on call 24 hours a day. Students should be vaccinated and have all possible dental and medical work completed before leaving home.
